# FIX MY STREET

Report, View or Discuss local Highways Problems – A Call to action

As residents you can quickly and easily report any highways defects directly to Lincolnshire County Council through their online portal FixMyStreet.

Items like potholes, broken paving slabs or street lighting can be reported online straight away. You can also check using a post code or street name and area if a defect has already been brought to LCC Highways attention and see what action is being taken. Each report is allocated a specific reference number and pictures or updates can be added to any existing item. Check on the progress of reports and receive alerts when something has been investigated or is being actioned.

**FixMyStreet** can be accessed either via the 'report a highways fault' link on the Parish Council web site or directly at the following address: https://fixmystreet.lincolnshire.gov.uk/

There is an App available on both Android and Apple stores.

#### Dear Residents

We hope you had a good Christmas and wish you all a very happy New Year. Your Parish Council meets to continue to review planning, highways and other day to day matters on behalf of the village. Copies of the minutes of meetings can now be found on our Parish Web site for full details of items discussed. At our January meeting the Council reviewed a budget for the 2022/23 financial year, taking into account some proposed projects for the forthcoming year, in order to set our precept request. It was agreed the precept level for 2022/23 would remain unchanged and will be held at the same amount for the fourth year running.

Consultations continue regarding highways issues and a new backing plate has been installed to allow a further site for the reactive speed sign. Details of how residents can report highways faults directly and quickly to LCC via **FixMyStreet** is available in this addition of the Yellow Pages or a link can be found on the Parish Web site. We would ask for your assistance in reporting faults wherever possible and if you have experienced problems due to road defects then please add your comments to the 'Fix our Funding to Fix our Roads' campaign to support the call for addition monies for Lincolnshire roads.

Hopefully you will have seen displayed the large poppies obtained last November to mark Remembrance Day and it is planned to have two 'Tommy' statues for the entrances to the village by this November. A wreath was also laid on behalf of the community by a representative of the Parish Council at the Remembrance Day Service

The noticeboard in the centre of the village has been removed to be renovated and it is planned to have an additional board in the same area housing a village map to aid the locating of properties. Designs are currently being reviewed and discussions had with the primary school to involve them in the 'redesign' of the noticeboard outside the school.

The Parish Council is working on drafting a 'Welcome Letter' for new residents providing local information and hopefully making them feel more involved with the community. Our Parish Website is being developed further to provide links to local groups/organisations as well as District and County services. Electronic past copies of Yellow Pages will also be available on the site.

Finally, this year as you will know is the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and the Parish Council will be liaising with other village organisations and the Community Centre on how this important event can be marked and celebrated.

#### Spirit of the Age

For 2019/20 Lincolnshire County Council had its maintenance funding from the Government cut by a massive  $\pounds 12m$ . This was to have a huge effect on the county's roads.

Because of the cash cut, county councillors voted to fill the void so that essential road works could still be carried out. They did this using council funding reserves for the year – but this is something that they won't be able to do in the future.

This missing £12m pays for filling 24,000 potholes and rebuilding 37 miles of deteriorating road per year.

Now, as the Department for Transport begins looking at funding allocations for 2022/23, we are calling on the Government to repair the £12m pothole it has left in our roads.

#### HELP US IN OUR FIGHT FOR MORE ROADS FUNDING

We're lobbying government, asking them to reinstate the  $\pounds 12$  million cut from our roads maintenance grant. So far, we've written to the Transport Secretary and are working with local MPs to bring this issue to the attention of the decision-makers in Westminster.

- The end of mandatory Covid passes in England, with businesses allowed to use them if they choose.
- Mandatory face masks will end, meaning people will not be criminalised for choosing not to wear them. School pupils will not be required to wear them from Thursday 20 January.
- The end to work-from-home guidance.
- Restrictions on care homes will be eased, with detail to be released.
- However, there will still be a legal requirement to self-isolate if you test positive for Covid.

## A Word from The Rectory

Dear friends,

I am writing this at the height of 'party-gate', with a series of revelations about lockdown parties in Downing Street coming to light and causing quite a stir! Who knows whether, by the time you read this, it has brought down the Prime Minister or has been long forgotten? But it is bad luck for Boris Johnson that these headlines coincide with the time when the Church traditionally reflects on what is perhaps the most famous 'bring your own booze' event of all time; Jesus' first miracle, the turning of water into wine at Cana.

Why did Jesus do it? A miracle is an event by which human beings are shown that there are things beyond our control and beyond our power: that the means of our salvation is no ordinary activity or project.
