LEGBOURNE PARISH COUNCIL

Notes from the Council meeting held on Monday 11th October 2021 at Legbourne Community Centre.

We are pleased to holding our Annual Parish Meeting this month on the 18th October 2021 and invitation flyers will be circulated to all households in the village. This is a Resident's meeting, not a Parish Council meeting and the agenda will include updates from other areas within the village such as the community centre, church, school and local police. Covid precautions will be in place and it is hoped as many residents as possible can attend to hear what the Parish Council has been up to and future plans for the village.

Five planning applications / variations were discussed.

a) N/100/01380/21 – The Old Vicarage, Station Road, Legbourne – Erection of a pair of semi-detached holiday cottages.

The Parish Council raised an observation regarding the street scene of this development should some of the established trees be removed. A request was made to ELDC to consider the replacement of removed trees to better screen the site and protect the street scene.

b) N/100/0634/21 – Change of use to land adjacent to Nutty Cottage, Louth Road for the siting of 30 no. touring caravan pitches, 5 no log cabins and 15 no. camping pods. In principle the Parish Council supports development of local business, however commented on the width of the entrance to this site off Louth Road. Highways were asked to consider whether a wider splay entrance might be appropriate.

c) N/100/02045/21, N/100/02046/21 & N/100/02072/21 – Change of use and conversion of land and existing dwellings at Grange Cottages., Furze Lane, Legbourne.

These applications were considered jointly and no objections or further comments were raised.

Discussion continued regarding the refurbishment of the village noticeboards and the addition of a further board to house a village map. A meeting has been arranged with Louth's Men's Shed to discuss costs and designs. It is hoped to involve the local school with ideas for the refurbishment design of one of the noticeboards.

The Local Listing Project for Historic sites was considered and will be discussed at the Annual Parish Meeting. It is hoped local residents may also have more information to share about the history of certain sites and buildings in the village.

This year the Parish Council have agreed to purchase some large poppies and two 'Tommy' statues to mark Remembrance Sunday in the village. A wreath will also be laid on behalf of the Parish Council on the 14th November.

Finally, the Parish Web site will be re-built in order to provide a better channel of information for the village with both Parish Council news and links to other organisations. Parish, District and County information will be available and local events such as the proposed Legbourne 'Park Runs' designed around community health to be set up by ClIr Stephenson in early November. We hope to be able to provide details of the relaunched web site in the next newsletter addition.



A Word from the Rectory

Dear friends,

One word that I find myself using or hearing more and more is the word 'sustainable'. A very brief definition would be that it refers to being able to maintain or keep something up. But we encounter it in all walks of life. Perhaps most urgently we speak of the need to become more environmentally sustainable. Bluntly put, the way we live our lives and organise our societies is not sustainable. It is damaging the environment to the point of crisis, and, as the slogan goes, 'there is no planet B!' We are hearing a lot about this particularly this month as Britain hosts the UN Climate Change Conference (COP 26).

The church must be taking a lead on how to meet the environmental crisis. To live unsustainably in this regard is, from a Christian perspective, to abuse the gift of God's creation. To help us meet this challenge the Diocesan Environmental Officer will be coming to speak to our deanery, and anyone interested is most welcome to attend (November 16th, Trinity Centre, Louth, 7pm).

But I am wrestling with 'sustainability' in other ways as well. For a long time, we, as the church in Lincolnshire, have been existing in a way that is not financially or practically sustainable either, and we also need now to address this, if we are to have churches here for future generations. Many people value our churches, as places to turn to at important moments in life (and death), or as quiet places of peace and sanctuary. But they rely entirely on an ever-diminishing number of people to keep going. A lack of committed people has led to a lack of money, which then leads to a lack of clergy, hence me having to move to Louth and take on oversight of a wider number of churches. We are wrestling with how to make our churches sustainable and resilient, so that they can continue - because they cannot be taken for granted, just like our climate. Just as with the climate crisis, the solution will necessarily involve more people to come on board. Trying to sustain our churches is not easy. But, as the scriptures remind us, 'where our treasure is, there our heart will be also' (Matthew 6.21). If we truly care about something, then we must be prepared to give of ourselves to support it
