# ALL SAINTS CHURCH A NEW START

All Saint's church has been overlooking the centre of Legbourne since late medieval times - about six hundred years. It was built over a period of twenty years or so in the late thirteen hundreds. But it would not have been the first church on the site -Christianity arrived in Lincolnshire in the early six hundreds – or at least it did for the purposes of this article, but when the first missionary priest set foot in Legbourne can never be known just as we will never know when the first church was built but it would have been a primitive building of timber or possibly mud and stud with a thatched roof and would have been replaced several times before the first stone-built church appeared: that is to say the one we know today.

This new church was probably paid for by a son of the village, John of Legbourne whose family were likely to have been lords of the manor.

With his income as Rector (1) of South Somercotes and as a Canon (2) of Lincoln Cathedral plus his accumulated wealth as executor of John of Gaunt (3) and a favoured servant of Henry IV (4) he would have been well placed to finance the building of a relatively modest parish church.

John's motives for doing so were perhaps threefold. He would have believed that by providing a place of worship that was so superior to what had gone before he would gain God's favour and the passage of his soul into heaven would be considerably eased. Secondly as patron and rector of this new church he would be entitled to the benefice. And lastly the church would provide a space for a chapel where a priest would be paid from money left by John Legbourne to chant prayers and perform the Mass at specified times to further assist the passage of John's soul into heaven after the shortest possible stay in purgatory - a sort of halfway house between heaven and hell where those guilty of relatively minor sins were painfully decontaminated in preparation for entry into heaven.

(1) Every parish church had an income called the benefice which came from three sources – Tithes – a compulsory levy on productive parishioners: The Glebe which was the church's share of the village's arable land and thirdly the fees charged for the sacraments – marriage, baptism, burial and the churching of women after childbirth. The rector was whoever received this with responsibility for its proper use.

- (2) The word Canon used in this context would refer to a paid member of the Cathedral's clerical staff.
- (3) Son of Edward III. In 1362 he became the biggest land owner in England. Characterised in Shakespeare's Richard II.
- (4) Henry IV. Born at Bolingbroke Castle in1366. King 1399 1413. Fell out with parliament for being too generous to his staff with tax money.

#### LITTLE CAWTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL

Little Cawthorpe Parish Council held a Meeting on 30 March 2022 at 7.30 pm at the Royal Oak.

The Parish Council expressed their sincere thanks to all the staff from the Royal Oak Public House, who had untaken defibrillator training. All of whom had passed with flying colours. Having a defibrillator in the village in such a central and easily found location is a real benefit to the village.

The Parish Councillors had also undertaken work to improve the pond environment and it wished to thank Mr Andrew Grantham and GBM for their assistance in providing equipment to enable this work to be completed.

It was noted that a tree had fallen and caused damage to the handrail and one of the church steps, this matter is in hand.

Road repair work is expected to commence very shortly in the Watery/Buston Lane area, notices are on the road to indicate the start date of this work.

The Parish Council had been approached by Legbourne Parish Council regarding silt deposits at the far end of the beck and it was agreed that both Parish Councils should work together to resolve this problem.

#### UPDATE FROM LEGBOURNE PARISH COUNCIL

#### Dear Residents

Your Parish Council met on the 11<sup>th</sup> April 2022 and continues to review planning, highways and other day to day matters on behalf of the village.

The refurbishment of the noticeboard has been completed by Louth Men's Shed and the board returned to its site in the village centre. It now looks very smart in heritage green, with a new oak named top board and will display Parish Council notices and pubic information. Any local groups or individuals wishing to put up a notice of public interest can do so by contacting the Parish Council Clerk or any Legbourne Parish Councillor.

It is planned that the village will also have a new map board and the Parish Council have commissioned a local graphics designer to work on the project. It is hoped that the new map design can be presented for residents to view at the next Annual Parish Meeting (Residents Meeting) planned for 27<sup>th</sup> June 2022.

Last month the Parish Council called for volunteers to support the village litter pick which was held on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2022. A big thank you to those residents who helped out on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, a good amount of rubbish was picked up and disposed of and we hope you agree the village looks better for it.

Planning applications received and reviewed:

There were no new planning applications received for consultation this month. Decision notice of approval of planning had been granted for Field View, Station Road, Legbourne.

Queries were raised regarding the recent highways resurfacing work to the roads off Mill Lane along with the lack of repair work to Mill Lane itself and other main roads in the village. It was agreed to consult with Cllr Parkin (LCC) and Highways to understand the 'thinking' around road repair projects in the village.

LCC County Views has been launched and details of this can be found on the Parish Noticeboard and web site. Road, transport and highways affect us all, so LCC are asking residents to take part in their county survey to inform them of your priorities on these important topics. Make a difference for everyone and join the survey panel. LCC's growing panel needs people from all ages and backgrounds to represent the views of Greater Lincolnshire. To register visit

Following the purchase of the new 'Tommy 'statues for the village it has been agreed with the church to site these near the war memorials in the churchyard, other than during the weeks running up to Remembrance Sunday when they will be positioned at the entrance gates to the village. It has also been proposed to consider some sites of historical interest in the village that could be marked with information plaques (similar to the historic blue plaques). This is an ongoing project so if residents consider there is any particular site that warrants a plaque, then please let one of your Councillors or the Clerk know your suggestion.
