


YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING TEAMS



INTRODUCTION



As we move in the second quarter of 2022 I am due to review the priorities for Neighbourhood Policing Team on Wolds for the last quarter and set new priorities for the next three months. The teams across Wolds have worked hard and implemented some fantastic measures to address the last priorities and we have seen some impressive results. We have also seen a change in crime patterns and offending which I will consider, alongside views from the community and public figures, when setting the new priorities.

Our previous priorities were:

Fatal Four – Driving Offences – This a regular area of concern for us and our residents and one which will always feature highly on our agenda, given the levels of risk and impact on other road users and the community. To enforce and address driving offences over this last quarter the teams have been busy completing “days of action” in problem areas, advising drivers on their standard of driving and handing out tickets and formal prosecutions where necessary – hundreds of vehicles have been checked throughout Wolds in this time, with further support from Road Traffic Units in specific locations. We have also worked closely with LRSP to conduct speed surveys in areas where problems have been highlighted and changes to road layouts and speed limits where necessary. We continue to educate drivers and deter and enforce the law through these measures.

ASB – As an NPT ASB is really our core area of business and as such makes up much of our day to day work. We identify offending persons/problem households and create cases to manage these individuals with the support of our partner agencies to solve these problems and through either prosecutions or other support/education to change behaviour and situations that are a cause of this. Over this last quarter the team have handed out several UBWL’s which intervene at an early stage and change behaviour, completed arrests and prosecutions, arrested for breaches of CBO’s, completed Warrants at addresses in relation to drugs and worked with other agencies to move individuals to other locations. The teams have worked hard to resolve several ongoing cases and make life easier for those members of the community impacted by this behaviour.

E-scooters – This was a big issue following the festive period for South Wolds. The team at Horncastle completed social media campaigns and local engagement to help advise people of the law surrounding the use of these scooters. This was very impactive as there was clearly a lack of understanding as to where they could be used and helping to create a wider understanding significantly helped reduce the use on the roads and public spaces. Persons found to be using them illegally were initially advised and any reoffending was dealt with by way of prosecutions and seizures. This reduced the issue swiftly and it is no longer a priority in the area.



Theft of Catalytic Converters - There was a large increase in these thefts which raised concern during the last quarter on North Wolds. The team at Louth quickly identified problem areas which were being targeted and put up signage/completed regular patrols to deter offenders. They also created social media campaigns and conducted crime reductions days an Aldi, Louth to educate drivers on how to deter criminals and offer free Smartwater kits to add to their vehicles. These innovative solutions quickly reduced offending and it is no longer a priority in the area.

Having liaised with the NPT Teams, our community and Public figures to ascertain current crime trends and areas of concern I have set the following priorities for the next quarter:


Fatal Four - Speeding, drink driving, driving whilst distracted and failure to wear a seatbelt.

ASB - Focussing on regular issues in the community across North/South Wolds







Rural Thefts (South Wolds) – New priority - This covers a wide spectrum from thefts of farm equipment to metal thefts and burglary.
