

Dear Residents

*****NEW CHAIRMAN*******

Your Parish Council met on the 9th May 2022 at the combined Annual Parish Council meeting and month Council meeting. **Cllr Cat Stephenson was voted in as Chairman of the Council for the forthcoming civic year, supported by Cllr Paul Maw who stepped back into the Vice Chair role.** Cllr Stephenson thanked his fellow Councillors for their support and Cllr Maw for his work as Chairman over the last couple of years, through what has been a challenging time with Covid.

The topic of road safety and speeding through the village was raised by a resident at the meeting and discussions took place with Cllr Parkin (LCC) regarding possible traffic calming measures. It was noted that different counties use a variety of methods such as statues of children by roadside and sleeping policemen in an attempt to manage speed. Cllr Parkin stated it was not within LCC Highways policy to use these road calming methods and that unfortunately technical difficulties existed in the centre of the village due to the bends in the roads to site a zebra crossing. It was agreed however that a safe crossing place nearer the Red Hen Nursery and increased lamp post signage could be submitted to LCC for consideration.

The audited Annual Parish Council accounts for 2021/22 were submitted for approval to Councillors and the dates for the notice of provision of public rights set. A report on the accounts for residents will also be made at the Annual Parish Council Meeting which is now set for June 27th 2022. This residents meeting which will give members of the community the chance to find out what their Parish Council have been up to over the last year and to make comments or suggestions about any aspects of village life. There will also be representation from other community groups at the meeting along with District and County Cllrs, so please come along and have your say. Invitations and agendas will be circulated to households shortly.

The village noticeboard is now back in situ in the village following its refurbishment and the Parish Council are currently working with a local designer to create a new village map which will be displayed in the centre of Legbourne. We hope to have a preview of the new map to present to residents at the Annual Parish Meeting on the 27th June.

Planning applications received and reviewed were as follows:

N/100/00694/22 The Old Vicarage, Stain Road, Legbourne – Erection of a detached 3 bay garage with roof space gym/office space. This application was supported by the Parish Council.

The Parish Council will also have a table at the village event for the Queens Jubilee at Legbourne 7 Little Cawthorpe Community Centre on Sunday 5th June 2022. Please come along and enjoy the days celebrations and if you have any questions for your Parish Councillors then visit us on the ‘Council’ table in the community centre hall.

The date of our next Parish Council meeting is **Monday 13th June 2022 @ 7:30pm**, Legbourne Community Centre. Visitors welcome, just come and listen or raise a comment / suggestion on any aspect of village life. Full details of Parish Council meetings and agendas can be viewed on the Parish website.

WHAT 3 WORDS?

Street addresses aren't accurate enough to specify precise locations, such as building entrances, and don't exist for parks and many rural areas. This makes it hard to find places and prevents people from describing exactly where help is needed in an emergency. That's why we created what3words.

What is what3words?

We divided the world into 3 metres squares and gave each square a unique combination of three words. It's the easiest way to find and share exact locations.

To find you more easily in an emergency, many UK Emergency Services are encouraging you to share your 3 word address.

How do I use what3words in an emergency?

1. Find the 3 word address for your current location on the free what3words app for [iOS](#) and [Android](#). It works offline – ideal for areas with unreliable data connection.
2. Share your 3 word address over the phone to the call handler.
3. The emergency service can then coordinate a response directly to the exact location where help is needed.

A Word from The Rectory

Dear friends,

This month of course serves as the focus for the Platinum Jubilee celebrations of Her Majesty the Queen. It is wonderful to see the many and varied ways in which our communities are planning to celebrate: church services of thanksgiving, fetes, picnics, maypole dancing and dressing up all feature. But I wonder if any of you are planning on using a ram's horn as a trumpet?

I mention this, as our word 'jubilee' comes from the Hebrew 'jobel', meaning ram's horn. The Bible commanded the people of Israel to hold a year of Jubilee every 50 years, and to announce the beginning of this year by sounding this horn (I think the ram had been removed first!). You can read about this in the Book of Leviticus, chapter 25, verses 1-13.

But what is the biblical jubilee? It was a year of liberation. Everyone was released from their debts. Prisoners and slaves were freed. And people were to return to their home towns and families, to rest from work and reconnect with who they were. It is the social equivalent of pressing the reset button on your computer when it stops working properly! Over 50 years, things would inevitably go wrong. Inequality or injustice would start to mount up. Disagreements would harden into hatred, and relationships break down. The jubilee year was a year to forget normal life, and mend what had become broken. To return to your roots, catch your breath and correct what needed correcting in your life.

As such, it is something we all could do with! So along with all the tea parties and merriment that will make up our physical jubilee celebrations, let us commit to keeping a spiritual jubilee, and taking the time to pause, think and put right those things that we have allowed to drift in all the business and distraction of modern living. What concrete thing might you do to achieve this? We do not need a ram's horn to sound to make us do so. We have the words of Jesus, who rose from the dead and so gives us the license and liberty to cast away our fears and follow him in perfect love.
