LEGBOURNE PARISH COUNCIL

Dear Residents

Your Parish Council met on the 14th November 2022 when they were joined with four members of the public. The applicants of planning application N/100/01972/22 – Land Behind the Woodlands, Mill Lane, Legbourne, presented information about the proposed development for the site. A large single dwelling had been proposed which the applicant aims to be as sympathetic as possible to the environment and in keeping with the surrounding area. It was noted that extensive environmental studies had been undertaken of the site prior to the submission of the planning application. A further resident wished to express their support for the proposal. The applicants were thanked for their information, and it was agreed the application would be discussed further under the planning agenda item.

Another resident raised concerns about the additional development of outbuildings on the Poplar site and it was agreed to review with ELDC that appropriate planning permission had been approved.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

The village entrance gates were decorated with large poppies and our two new 'Tommy' statues were sited at each end to mark Remembrance Day. Cllr Stephenson laid a poppy wreath at the memorial on Remembrance Sunday on behalf of the Parish Council and parishioners of Legbourne.

PLANNING

The following planning applications had been submitted for consultation:

N100/01749/22 Brandon Lodge, Station Road, Legbourne, Louth, LN11 8LL – Planning permission – Extensions and alterations to existing dwelling to provide additional living accommodation. Following debate, the Parish Council agreed to support this application.

N/100/01850/22 – Plot 2 Land adjacent Wildrose Cottage, Reston Road, Legbourne, LN11 8LS Planning permission – Erection of house and detached double garage with games room over and construction of a vehicle /pedestrian access. Following debate, the Parish Council agreed to support this application.

N/100/01972/22 Land behind the Woodlands, Mill Lane, Legbourne. Planning permission – Erection of a detached dwelling with a detached pavilion and tennis court

with associated fencing, excavation of land to provide a pond and construction of a vehicle access. Having heard from the applicants regarding the details of the proposed development the Parish Council debated this application further. Cllrs were divided regarding their views on this application with further questions being raised. This resulted in no clear vote being reached.

Therefore, in view of the significance of this planning application and to give adequate time to debate the proposal fully, a Parish Council Planning Meeting will be held on Monday 28th November 2022. This meeting like all Parish Council meetings will be open to the public to attend, should they wish and to raise any comment or question regarding this planning application,

EIA/36/22 – Request for a Scoping Opinion on the Development for an Anaerobic Digester and Fertiliser production plant – Manby, Louth. The Parish Council agreed further questions needed to be asked about the storage of environmentally hazardous products on this proposed site and the odour control measures that would be in place.

COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

The Parish Council have been considering a stone plaque at the site of the village pump to provide local historic information. A project meeting will be held to look at design and obtain quotes for the work.

Cllr Grist informed the meeting that the joint silt clearance project of the wet road had now been completed with Little Cawthorpe Parish Council. It was agreed this would be an ongoing project that both Councils would work in conjunction on going forward.

NOTICE & MAP BOARD PROJECTS

Our designer John Burrell continues to work on the map project to incorporate the elements from the traditional water coloured version with a new outline map. The Parish Council agreed to get the noticeboard outside the village school refurbished and a new headboard added to it in keeping with the noticeboard in the centre of the village. This will provide an additional location for local information at that end of Legbourne.

PARISH COUNCILLOR VACANCY

A vacancy is still available to join Legbourne Parish Council as a co-opted Councillor. If you would like to get involved with supporting your village and shaping some of the decisions that are taken locally then we would be keen to hear from you.
